The Excitement is Building! Haywood Estates Underway...

Beaches Habitat for Humanity has embarked on its most ambitious project to date, a 32 home development named Haywood Estates located on the corner of Mayport Road and A1A. Infrastructure work has begun and the site is visible from A1A just before Lakeside Apartments. A box culvert, which will cross Sherman's Creek on A1A, will provide access to the new development.

The development is named in honor of Haywood Ball, an attorney from Donahoo Ball & McMenamy, who has closed on all 180 homes (pro bono) built by Beaches Habitat for Humanity since 1991. In addition, Haywood has served as past President of our affiliate as well as member of our Site Committee which has helped

us acquire affordable building sites at the Beaches, a difficult task at best. Thanks to Haywood's help, we now have a three year inventory of building sites.

The 32 homes will include a mix of one & two story duplexes ranging from two to five bedroom designs. Each home will include central air, appliances (donated to all Habitat affiliates by Whirlpool), as well as floor and window treatment. Our goal is to make all our homes receive the ENERGY STAR, a joint program of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the US Department of Energy helping us save money and protect the environment through energy efficient products and practices. This will help reduce the burden of large utility bills and make our even homes more affordable despite some up front costs to meet these goals.

In addition to providing simple decent affordable housing, our Education Program sets us apart from most other Habitat affiliates. These new families will be provided with opportunities that run from elementary school

through college. Our Prep Club program provides generous cash awards to children for both perfect attendance and academic excellence. Our After School Tutoring Program at both the Donner and Jordan Community Centers in Atlantic Beach-helps over 50 students with their reading and math skills. After high school, fully paid scholarships are available at both the University of North Florida and Florida Community College at Jacksonville. The UNF scholarship (covering all tuition, books, fees and campus expenses) program is available to any family whose high school student is admitted to the university. UNF has the capacity to award 5 new scholarships every year. A similar program at FCCJ can award 40 new scholarships each year. This program can be used by the entire family, including parents, for specialized job training or to obtain an Associates Degree.

One Week to Make a Difference

In August of 2005 one of the deadliest storms hit the Gulf coast devastating millions. Hurricane Katrina a Category 5 storm hit the coast causing billions of dollars in damage, leaving close to a million people homeless and killing thousands.

Almost three years later and the rebuilding continues. Tens of thousands still remain homeless or misplaced. This year Habitat for Humanity's '**Jimmy and Rosalynn Carter Work Project**' was committed to get the people from the Gulf Coast back into decent affordable housing. This year brought together the Carter Project and the Americorps Build-A-Thon. Over 1,000 volunteers from all over the world came to the coast to join in, including four Beaches Habitat AmeriCorps staff and Volunteer Coordinator Caja Kelly.



The group left early Sunday morning wide eyed and ready to give "a hand up". Mia, Joe and Bethany built brand new homes in Biloxi while Rob rehabbed homes in Gulfport. Caja was a media and VIP escort also in Gulfport. Our members worked long hours in pouring rain but it was all worthwhile. Rob Kennedy says, "It was fun to work with the homeowner and meet the families." "As a former resident of Gulfport, it's great to see that this area has not been forgotten—there is still a lot of work to be done," said Caja.



By the end of the week when the dust had settled and the rain had stopped, 42 families got to go home again, after three years. 10 more homes will be finished in the next month and another 20 rehabs will be finished thanks to all the generous volunteers who took one week to help make a difference. Over 51 local organizations participated in the program, including Beaches Habitat. *Birdies for Charity* serves as a great way to support local charities by tracking and keeping up with the world's best golfers during The Players.

The pledge for each birdie must be a minimum of two cents. Beaches Habitat had a variety of generous pledges even up to 15 cents a birdie.

Birdies for Charity also increases excitement as participants had the opportunity to guess the number of birdies made during the tournament. The participant who guessed correctly this year won a trip for two to Scottsdale, Ariz. This grand prize includes a three night stay at the Fairmont Scottsdale Princess, roundtrip airfare, golf at TPC Scottsdale, lessons at The Tour Academy, as well as other amenities. The *Birdies for Charity* Grand Prize Winners for 2008 are Rick and Cindy Stinson who contributed to the St. Johns County Education Foundation.

How many birdies do you think were made during The Players? In 2007, 1370 birdies were made, 2006, 1385 birdies were made. This year's total reached 1241 birdies during the four day tournament due to intense wind and weather conditions. As for the winner of The Players, Champion Sergio Garcia, contributed a total of 17 birdies during the competitive rounds.

Homeowner Father of the Year, Nelson Osorio

Beaches Habitat is proud to honor Nelson Osorio as the Homeowner Father of the Year for 2008.

Nelson, a single parent of two daughters, lives in Sawgrass Chapel Place. Nelson has raised both daughters alone for the past 10 years. He says that being a single parent “is not a choice, [but] you have to do it. You have to understand the consequences and understand the responsibility of raising two kids alone,” says Nelson.

Before living in his Beaches Habitat Home, Nelson lived with his sister and her family. Seven people occupied the small house where Nelson, his sister and their families lived. Nelson recalls sleeping on the couch each night so his two daughters Erica, 12, and Auldrey, 13, could share a bedroom. “I needed [the Habitat house] for my kids,” Nelson says. “They needed a good place to live.”

So far Nelson and his family have lived in the Beaches Habitat house for six months. Nelson says being a homeowner makes life a bit more comfortable. “We enjoy it, the kids are happy to have their privacy as they shared a tiny bedroom before,”

Nelson is not only a full-time father, but also works at Avante of Jacksonville Beach Nursing Home. If that is not enough, Nelson is enrolled at FCCJ taking night courses. Nelson hopes by taking classes at the community college he will further his understanding of the English language. Nelson is originally from the Philippines.

Nelson, although busy as can be, smiles and laughs each day. Beaches Habitat is thankful and blessed to have such a remarkable home owner and father.



Volunteer Father of the Year, Steve McCollum

Beaches Habitat is excited to award Steve McCollum the Volunteer Father of the Year Award for 2008.

McCollum and his wife, Dee, were 20 years old when they married in Columbus, Ohio. A college student, Steve managed to work two jobs and go to school while raising two children with Dee. After college two more children came along making the McCollum family complete... for a little while at least.

It was there in Columbus where Steve discovered Habitat for Humanity. Steve began volunteering his time with the ReStore of Habitat for Humanity-

Greater Columbus.

When he and his wife moved to Jacksonville, Steve continued building and volunteering with Beaches Habitat. Steve enjoys volunteering his time at Beaches Habitat saying it is small enough to where “you actually work with the people you are helping.” “It is so neat to see kids come home from school and play ball in the yard and somehow I had a part in that,” says Steve.

As the years passed and the children moved out of the house and had large families of their own, McCollum and his wife were left in the nest without children, a dream retirement for some parents. It wasn’t till their son John adopted a child from Vietnam when the McCollum’s considered adopting a child of their own. “I became very interested,” says Dee. “I just kept going online and looking into it thinking that our house seemed empty.” Steve added saying, “we were thinking about what we enjoyed most about our life, and we loved the parts that included children.”

After more research and prayer the McCollums made the decision to adopt a four-year-old child from China, Sarah. Both Steve and his wife were 57 years old with four children ages ranging in the thirties to forties.

Recalling the trip to get Sarah, Dee says “It was August and ten times as hot as it is here.” After a 36 hour flight, the two arrived with no time to relax and went straight to the orphanage where Sarah lived. “She came to us with a few toys and the clothes on her back,” says Steve. Steve recalls the first night after picking up Sarah saying, “She was scared. I spent that first night at the door of her room in the hotel making sure she didn’t try to sneak out and leave,” says Steve.

Sarah, now age 11, calls her parents “the old couple.” Steve and his wife Dee laugh saying, “life with Sarah is definitely not boring.” Steve smiles and says “I don’t even know what retired people do all day.”


